New Dewberry Arena Update

2016 has definitely not been the best year to have started construction on a major project such as the Dewberry Arena—economic downturn in the energy sector and ensuing spinoff slowdowns has made fundraising difficult to say the least, however we have overcome the odds and have had some amazing results from some wonderful donors and we can say that our expectations have been exceeded! Meter Replacement and Upgrade Project
Involving
Villages of Dewberry, Marwayne and Kitscoty**

The Villages of Dewberry, Marwayne and Kitscoty Will be undertaking the replacement/installation of residential and commercial water meters in the Villages.

Thank you to all who have made installation appointments/had their water meters replaced, for those who have not done so please make your installation appointment soon.

As of the date of newsletter printing the Village of Dewberry has 13 installation appointments made and 47 installations completed. The Village for both residential and commercial have approximately 125 utility accounts so we are getting there, please help and make your appointment today. The Villages will be installing leak sensors on every second service line to help detect leaks. This will occur at the same time that the new remote read water meters are being installed. These leak sensors will be installed permanently on the water service pipes, usually near a water meter. The strategically placed sensors analyze water consumption patterns every day, detecting new, evolving and pre-existing leaks automatically. The ability to remotely monitor data from the sensors will help identify loss patterns within the distribution system at specific locations, help ensure more sustainable water use, as well as analyze seasonal water use anomalies. By flagging areas of change within the system this indicates the probability that a leak has formed.
